Good afternoon to all of you

But we also need mentors, guides, counsellors and coaches. Mark my words, ladies and gentlemen, this program generate interest because the pedagogy it resorts to is one that will strike a positive chord in our students. The videos that will be used as resources have something that speaks in their favour they have an open end note meaning that the realistic situations and dilemmas young people confront provide the space for interaction will catalyse open debates and discussions. And that is what students relish most—non-prescriptive and open-ended dialogue, one that provides a platform for, self-reflection, critical thinking and creativity.

I would really wish you to see this whole exercise as having an inter-generational impact. Remember that by investing in Educators' training, we are investing in the future of our society.
