QUESTION OF: PROHIBITING ARBITRARY DEPRIVATION OF LIFE, SLAVERY AND FORCED LABOUR

The General Assembly,

Recalling to all Member States that, under The Human Rights Act, everyone has the right to a fair trial, the right to privacy, and the right to be free from inhumane and degrading treatment,

Expressing deep concern over reports of arbitrary deprivation of life, extrajudicial killings, enforced disappearances, and practices of slavery and forced labour,

Concerned about the prevalence of Modern Slavery, Forced Labour and Human Trafficking across several countries despite the laws enforced by the International Covenant On Civil And Political Rights,

Deeply conscious about the struggles to gather evidence against forced labour and the victims' lack of knowledge about their rights,

Deeply concerned about forced marriage, sexual exploitation and lack of implementation of Women's Rights,

Fully alarmed about significant conflicts including invasion of ISIS, sectarian violence and ongoing political instability,

Deploring the predominance of death penalty and the breach of rights of life across the world,

1. Acknowledges the importance of trade unions, sensitizing the population and providing robust legal frameworks and enforcement mechanisms to address these grave human rights violations;
2. Calls for the law enforcement agencies to investigate and prosecute cases of Arbitrary Deprivation of life and implementation of specific legislation that explicitly prohibits Modern Slavery, Forced Labour and Human Trafficking;
3. Urges support from NGOs and the provision of training programs for members of the organisation;
4. Requests the daily inspections in susceptible households;
5. Further requests the provision of medical care, psychological counselling and vocational training;
6. Renews its appeal for the implementation of international treaties related to Human Rights;
7. Urges the abolishment of the death penalty in order to align with the philosophy of the United Nations.
