# COMMUNIQUE

## <u>SCHOLARSHIPS FOR DIPLOMA/DEGREE COURSES – 2024</u> <u>UNDER THE SUGAR INDUSTRY – VRS SCHOLARSHIPS SCHEME FOR</u> <u>THE ROSE BELLE SUGAR ESTATE BOARD</u>

Applications for the award of scholarships are invited from children of retired workers of the Sugar Industry under the Voluntary Retirement Scheme of the Rose Belle Sugar Estate Board (VRS) and who are being admitted to:

- (i) any locally recognized Higher Education Institution in 2024 (Academic Year 2024/2025); and
- (ii) any local training institution duly registered with the Mauritius Qualifications Authority.

Two scholarships will be awarded yearly to the children of the workers concerned by the VRS Scheme.

#### 2. Course of Study

Preference will be given to candidates whose Fields of Study are specific to the prevailing scarcity areas and market demands of the country and to courses appearing on the List of Indicative Priority Fields of Study 2021/2023 available for consultation at the Scholarships Section, Ministry of Education, Tertiary Education, Science and Technology and at Ground Floor, MITD House, Phoenix, or on the following website:

#### 3. Eligibility Criteria

#### A. For Undergraduate

- (i) Candidates should have obtained admission for diploma/degree courses for intake of Academic Year 2024-2025 in any locally recognized Higher Education Institution; and
- (ii) Candidates who have enrolled for a **part-time diploma/degree course** may also apply. However, **priority will be given to full- time students**.

#### B. For Technical and Vocational Education Training (TVET) Courses

Candidates should have secured a seat for a **fully accredited full time** /**part time** National Diploma/Higher National Diploma in a **local** training institution duly registered with the Mauritius Qualifications Authority.

### C. For Professional Courses

Candidates should have secured a seat in a fully accredited full- time professional programme of not less than one full year of study at recognized local training institution duly registered with the Higher Education Commission.

#### Note:

- I. Candidates who have been enrolled for a part-time diploma/degree course may also apply. However, **priority will be given to full-time students.**
- II. Foundation courses will **not** be covered under the Scholarships Scheme.
- III. The list of recognised accredited courses in registered TVET institutions is available on the MQA website <u>www.mqa.mu</u> and affixed at the seat of the respective institutions.
- IV. The list of fully accredited courses at undergraduate level is available on the Higher Education Commission website <u>www.hec.mu</u>
- 3.1 Candidates should show evidence that their parents were workers of Rose Belle Sugar Estate Board who have terminated their contract of employment in 2023 under the Voluntary Retirement Scheme.
- 3.2 Students should not be more than **30 years old** on the closing date for submission of application.

#### 4. General conditions

- (i) Selected candidates will be required to:
  - (a) sign a contract with the Rose Belle Sugar Estate Board;
  - (b) submit relevant documents as required by the Mauritius Cane Industry Authority (MCIA)/Policy Planning Unit (PPU);
  - (c) submit their progress reports to the Rose Belle Sugar Estate Board and MCIA/PPU; and
  - (d) inform the MCIA/PPU and the Rose Belle Sugar Estate Board of the completion date of their courses.
- (ii) Beneficiaries will receive a yearly allowance of Rs 30,000 for a maximum of four years. The modalities of payment will be mutually agreed upon between the student and Sugar Company.
- (iii) In the event a candidate discontinues his/her course, he/she shall inform the MCIA/PPU and the Rose Belle Sugar Estate Board giving the reasons thereof.

#### 5. Mode of application

 Applications must be made on the prescribed form available at the Scholarships Section, Ministry of Education, Tertiary Education, Science and Technology, 1<sup>st</sup> Floor, MITD House, Phoenix and can also be downloaded from the Ministry's website on:

- (ii) Along with their applications the candidates should **also** submit **certified** copies of the following documents:-
  - (a) Their Birth Certificate and National Identity Card;
  - (b) Birth Certificate(s) and National Identity Card(s) of Parent(s);
  - (c) Copy of signed option form and "Quittance" of Parents having retired under VRS Scheme;
  - (d) SC or GCE 'O' Level Certificate;
  - (e) HSC or GCE 'A' Level Certificate; and
  - (f) Evidence of enrolment in a recognized Post-Secondary Education Institution in Mauritius.
- (iii) Candidates should ensure that certified copies of certificates and all other relevant documents relating to their qualifications are submitted to the Scholarships Section by the closing date. Non-submission of these documents on time will result in their elimination from the selection exercise. Certification of documents may be done at the Scholarships Section of the Ministry.
- (iv) The completed Application Forms along with all supporting documents should be returned to the Scholarships Section, 1<sup>st</sup> Floor, MITD House, Phoenix by *Friday 28<sup>th</sup> June 2024 at latest.*

6. Candidates are strongly advised not to wait for the last day to submit their applications.

7. Candidates who have not been informed of their nominations within two months as from the closing date for application should consider that they have not been selected.

8. A Communiqué will be placed on the Website in due course to inform applicants that the selection exercise has been completed.
