INTRODUCTION

Education in Mauritius is compulsory from age five up to age sixteen. The present education system allows a pupil to study for two years at the pre-primary level. This sub-sector builds the foundations upon which all future learning depends. The Nine Year Continuous Basic Education (NYCBE) policy, effective since 2017, focusses on a sound foundation for learning and self-development, with a strong emphasis on the holistic development of the learner. The Primary School Achievement Certificate (PSAC) marks the culmination of six years of primary education following which students progress seamlessly to secondary schools where students complete the last three years of the Nine Year Continuous Basic Education (NYCBE) cycle.

With a view to ensuring a more inclusive and tailored learning experience, a flexible curriculum is offered to accommodate students with diverse abilities, aptitudes, and learning paces. Students who do not meet the requirements at the PSAC are provided with an extended four-year cycle to complete their basic education.

The National Certificate of Education (NCE) assessment concludes and certifies the level of attainment at the end of the NYCBE cycle. Several educational pathways are offered to students who can opt for upper secondary education or choose vocational or technical education programs, aligning their educational journey with their aspirations and interests. Students, after the School Certificate (SC), may join the technical education sector or continue their studies in the upper secondary cycle.

The upper secondary cycle, which concludes at Grade 13, leads to the Higher School Certificate (HSC)/General Certificate of Education (GCE-A level).

Upon successfully completing the HSC/A level, students are eligible for studies offered by technical or higher education institutions.

The Tertiary Education sector comprises of a wide range of higher educational institutions, amongst which ten are publicly funded with a further thirty-six institutions being privately owned and managed.

The data refer to the Republic of Mauritius and cover the pre-primary, primary, secondary, technical and vocational as well as education in specialized institutions and tertiary subsectors.






PUBLIC EXPENDITURE ON EDUCATION BY SECTOR





In March 2023, there were 770 schools providing pre-primary education, representing a decrease of 2.4% compared to October 2021. Of these schools, 190 were run by the state (i.e Early Childhood Care and Education Authority) and the remaining 580 were privately run. In March 2023, total enrolment in pre-primary schools numbered 23,787 of whom 11,705 were girls. Enrolment in pre-primary schools increased by 184 from October 2021 to March 2023. In March 2023, the pre-primary teaching staff was 1,762 representing a decrease of around 3.8% compared to October 2021.



Percentage of primary enrolment by type of administration, 2023





In March 2023, there were 325 schools providing primary education, representing an increase of 1.9% compared to October 2021. The majority (220) of the schools was run by government, 53 were private-aided and 52 were private unaided schools. The primary school population in the Republic of Mauritius stood at 89,001 in March 2023, representing an increase of 5.8% compared to October 2021. Girls represented 49.3% of the 2023 primary school population. The primary education teaching staff was 5,640 in March 2023, represening a decrease of around 5.0% compared to October 2021.

In March 2023, there were 179 schools dispensing secondary education. State-administered schools numbered 69, while the remaining 110 were private schools. A slight decrease in the number of Private Aided schools was noted from October 2021 to March 2023. Secondary education enrolment decreased by 3.7%, from 102,722 in October 2021 to 98,900 in March 2023. In March 2023, the number of teachers working in secondary schools was 8,992 representing a decrease of 4.1% over the 2021/2022 figure.









The majority of tertiary students (84.7%) were enrolled locally in both public funded institutions (54.7%) and private institutions (30.0%). The remaining 15.3% of students were enrolled overseas. Business, Administration and Law is the most popular discipline (51.4%), followed by Information and Communication Technologies (8.9%), Health & Welfare (8.1%), Education (7.9%), Engineering, Manufacturing & Construction (6.2%), Social Sciences, Journalism and Information (5.4%), Services, Other field of study & Agriculture (12.1%).



In 2021/2022, the number of school candidates who took part in PSAC Assessment in the Republic of Mauritius was 16,011. Excluding re-assessment, the overall percentage meeting PSAC requirement works out to 80.6. It is to be noted that the percentage meeting PSAC requirement, including re-assessed school candidates, works out to 83.1. The performance of girls, including re-assessment exceeded that of boys with respective pass rates of 87.8% and 78.2%.



GLOSSARY

1 Adult Literacy Rate

Percentage of persons aged 15 years and above who can, with understanding, both read and write a simple statement.

2 Apparent Intake Rate

Number of new entrants in Grade 1 in primary schools as a percentage of the population aged 5 years.

3 Gross Domestic Product (GDP) at Market Price

The aggregate money value of all goods and services produced within the country out of the economic activity during a specified period of time usually a year (before provision for the consumption of fixed capital) at basic prices plus taxes on products.

4 Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER)

Number of pupils enrolled in a given level of education, regardless of age, expressed as a percentage of the population in the relevant age-group:

- \rightarrow 4-5 years for pre-primary level
- \rightarrow 6-11 years for primary level
- →12-19 years for secondary level
- → 20-24 years for tertiary level

5 Gender Parity Index (GPI)

Ratio of the GER for female to the GER for male. It measures the relative education participation of boys and girls. A GPI of 1 reflects equal enrolment rate for boys and girls, whereas a GPI greater than 1 shows disparity in favour of girls.

6 Literacy Gender Parity Index

The ratio of adult female literacy rate to adult male literacy rate. A perfect Gender Parity Index would imply that the index is equal to 1

7 Literacy Rate

Percentage of persons aged 12 years and above who can, with understanding, both read and write a simple statement.

8 Population Growth Rate (PGR)

It is the rate at which the number of individuals in a population increases in a given time period as a fraction of the initial population. Specifically, PGR ordinarily refers to the change in population over a unit time period, often expressed as a percentage of the number of individuals in the population at the beginning of that period.

9 Primary Completion Rate

The ratio of the number of pupils successfully completing the last year of primary school (Grade 6) in a given year to the total number of children aged 10 years in the population.

10 Pupil/Teacher Ratio

The average number of pupils per teacher at a given level of education in a given year.

11 Unemployment Rate

Unemployment rate is the ratio (%) of unemployment to labour force.
