Short Background:

With the widespread adoption of AI, cases of gender related bias and discrimination in AI systems are emerging from job hiring algorithms to facial recognition systems and more recently in generative AI systems for image and video production. As the harms of such systems cut across several human rights, the judiciary is called upon to adjudicate cases at intersection of technology and gender rights. At the same time, there are opportunities to use AI in judicial administrations to advance gender equality.

The webinar will discuss i) how judiciaries ensure fair and unbiased adjudication, ii) promote gender equality in the judiciary with the use of AI by learning from the insights of judges, court officials, researchers and legal practitioners from different parts of the world.

Objective:

This webinar will highlight gender bias implications arising from the use of AI by the judiciary and AI generated content in adjudication processes in the dispute resolution system.
