QUESTION OF : DEVISING REALISTIC MEASURES TO PROTECT SEAS AND OCEANS

The General Assembly,

<u>Alarmed</u> by the fact that overfishing is draining the marine life of our waters,

<u>Fully aware of</u> the Great Pacific Garbage Patch in our oceans, which is growing in size,

<u>Bearing in mind</u> that climate change is quickly becoming a major threat to marine species and can eventually cause extinction of various aquatic animals,

<u>Recalling</u> that chemicals are being washed into the sea, leading to marine pollution and other deadly consequences,

<u>Taking into consideration</u> that coral reefs have been facing many threats notably due to climate change, coral mining, dynamite fishing activities and plastic consumption,

<u>Keeping in mind</u> that deforestation of mangroves as main source of wood for charcoal results in critical harm to the environment,

1. <u>Condemns</u> the use of single-use petroleum based plastics while proposing the use of other alternatives;

2. <u>Encourages</u> the creation and improvement of new technology to better our marine ecosystem;

3. <u>Requests</u> governments across the world to implement policies pertaining to the protection of seas and oceans;

4. <u>Recommends</u> more laws to be passed by the government to reduce marine degradation;

5. <u>Stresses</u> on the need to set up local organizations to protect the seas and oceans and sensitize citizens on the importance of the marine resources through awareness campaigns;

6. <u>Recommends</u> for a more environmentally responsible and controlled development across the tourism industry, building clear standards for activities undertaken, in order to protect wildlife pertaining to the oceans;

7. <u>Further requests</u> that fishing gears and nets be made of biodegradable materials to avoid long run negative impacts on the marine environment;

8. <u>Calls upon</u> external help from the organizations like the World Bank and IMF and developed countries to finance programmes such as recycling, trash removal, wastewater treatment among others especially in developing countries;

10. <u>Further recommends</u> the restoration of the stocks by establishing a no fishing period until it reaches a level of maximum sustainable yield from fishing;

11. <u>Requests</u> proper disposal of hazardous materials and stern controls over chemicals and agricultural waste which can lead to devastating effects in the sea;

12. <u>Draws attention</u> to the phenomenon of Global Warming whose nefarious effects need to be combated by each member state through eco-friendly ways of development in line with SDG 14;

13. <u>Expresses its appreciation</u> to The Nature Conservancy which has been planting mangroves to reduce erosion and decrease sedimentation issues and while requesting the setting up of mangrove nurseries;

14. <u>Expresses its appreciation</u> that the WWF is working together with governments, research institutes and international NGOs, to create more Marine Protected Areas in high seas;

15. <u>Appeals</u> for a global ban on items exploiting marine life and having catastrophic consequences on oceans and wildlife.
