QUESTION OF: EMPOWERING WOMEN FOR ACTIVE PARTICIPATION IN POLITICS AND BETTER GOVERNANCE

The General Assembly,

<u>Stressing</u> on the fact that with the male dominated nature of politics, women experience a low self-esteem, bringing to a consequent gender gap, thereby restricting their talents and expertise,

<u>Conscious</u> that the orthodox culture of women's domain to only be household responsibilities still prevails in many societies which results in a lack of public support for women wishing to join politics,

<u>Grieved</u> by the matter that a lack of financial resources can limit the participation of female politicians particularly the funds required for electoral campaigns,

<u>Noting with regret</u> that the level of involvement of women in national parliaments is less than 30%,

<u>Concerned</u> by the threats towards women, who actively participate actively in politics, by ethnic groups due to cultural barriers preventing them from being involved in politics,

1. <u>Demands</u> that pressure should be exerted on concerned political parties to ensure the rights of women in politics and leaderships;

2. <u>Calls upon media</u> to eradicate any form of gender inequality by ensuring women's political views are represented in their respective coverage;

3. <u>Confirms</u> that trainings and workshops organised, with a special focus on young women, would provide potential female leaders with knowledge and skills;

4. <u>Acknowledges</u> that some governments are designing awareness campaigns to sensitize the public about sexism and misogyny and to empower women to play an active role in politics;

5. <u>Recommends</u> the authorities to fund grassroots organisations that build the capacity of girls and women to participate both individually and collectively in social, economic, political, and public life;

6. <u>Supports</u> the access of women's participation in politics by creating awareness about equality between strereotypes;

7. <u>Further invites</u> women's organisations to promote advocacy for education by encouraging crossregional participation that brings women and men together to bridge geographic and ideological divisions;

8. <u>Calls upon</u> on female politician to create a women council centre where all problems connecting to gender equality is taken into consideration;

9. <u>Emphasizes</u> that women should have equal rights as men to represent their countries at international level;

10. <u>Urges</u> the government to establish laws such as quotas to encourage and promote equal participation of both women and men in politics.
