QUESTION OF: ENABLING SIDS TO COMBAT RISKS ASSOCIATED WITH CLIMATE VARIABILITY AND UNSUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT PRACTICES

The General Assembly,

<u>Realising</u> that small islands are threatened by the rise in sea level caused by global warming,

<u>Deeply concerned</u> by the fact that rising temperature is having unfortunate health impacts including the development and spread of vector borne diseases,

<u>Emphasizing</u> the fact that increasing ocean acidification is negatively impacting coral reefs resulting in higher intensity of tropical cyclones,

<u>Noting further</u> that modern agriculture is exploiting land more intensively than it has in the past,

<u>Realising</u> that our current unsustainable development practices have resulted in a rise in the loss of biodiversity,

<u>Recognising</u> that SIDS face numerous challenges related to freshwater resources including water pollution and water scarcity,

- 1. <u>Encourages</u> the government to implement measures to reduce greenhouse gases and short-lived climate pollutants such as black carbon;
- 2. <u>Recommends</u> the practice of the 3Rs; Reduce, Reuse and Recycle ;

 - 3. <u>Requests</u> the World Health Organisation (WHO)to join hands with the National Centre for Emerging and Zoonotic Infectious Diseases and improved access to medication;
 - 4. <u>Urges</u> member states to organise sensitisation campaigns to educate people about the repercussions of these diseases and how to combat them;
 - 5. <u>Further</u> requests governments to educate people about ocean acidification;
 - 6. <u>Calls upon</u> governments to enforce regulations on factories especially those using fossil fuels;
 - 7. <u>Exresses its</u> convinction that with more Research and Development (R&D) activities, new methods to improve soil quality can be found;
 - 8. <u>Suggests</u> training local people to use both traditional knowledge and modern science which will root sustainability in island communities;
 - 9. <u>Calls upon</u> SIDS to encourage reforestation and prevent deforestation with more severe laws and regulations.
 - 10. <u>Further recommends</u> ecological restoration and reclamation, both on the short term and long term;
 - 11. <u>Supports</u> the development of institutional and human capacities for the effective, inclusive and sustainable implementation of the integrated management of water resources and related ecosystems;
