QUESTION OF: ADDRESSING STATELESSNESS TO ENSURE BETTER FUTURE FOR NEW GENERATIONS.

The General Assembly,

<u>Noting with concern</u> that birth records are destroyed in conflict-driven or disaster-prone countries hindering access to proof of identity leading to risks of inability to prove nationality,

<u>Having studied</u> that the denial or deprivation of nationality to exclude and marginalize unpopular racial, religious or ethnic minorities have been the cause of global statelessness,

<u>Alarmed by the fact</u> that refugees encounter issues such as limited access to potable water, living space, hygiene and unemployment on the long term,

<u>Deploring</u> that stateless individuals are deprived of fundamental human rights and are in vulnerable positions to become victims of sexual and physical violence as well as human trafficking,

<u>Emphasizing</u> on the lack of appropriate mechanisms and legislation to effectively protect stateless people at international standards,

1. <u>Urges</u> the government to issue birth certificates to all children born on territories, on a Jus Soli basis;

2. <u>Stresses</u> the importance of amending nationality laws in accordance to with international standards design at legislative level;

3. <u>Encourages</u> the development of an inter-governmental strategy compromising of a National Action Plan to prevent and reduce statelessness;

4. <u>Urges</u> the setting up of camps with proper technology and healthcare to enable a concentrated protection and surveillance of stateless people;

5. <u>Encourages</u> the establishment of a database with accurate and reliable information on statelessness for reference and further acceleration of procedures for acquiring nationality;

6. <u>Requests</u> permissibility at executive level for reacquisition of nationality in case of loss of acquired nationality;

7. <u>Draws attention</u> to the provision of guidelines and technical assistance by UNHCR to legislations to establish procedures to recognize stateless people and naturalize them;

8. <u>Encourages</u> countries to provide nationality to stateless people over a binding work contract whereby stateless people are to be considered as the working capital of countries;

9. <u>Encourages</u> the use of body screening and strong border control with an aim to minimize human trafficking;

10. <u>Urges</u> all members to ratify conventions on statelessness and work closely together towards promoting SDG 17.
