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INTRODUCTION

Education in Mauritius is compulsory from age five up to age sixteen. The present education system allows a pupil to study for two years at the pre-primary level. This sub-sector builds the foundations upon which all future learning depends. The Nine Year Continuous Basic Education (NYCBE) policy, effective since 2017, focusses on a sound foundation for learning and self-development, with a strong emphasis on the holistic development of the learner. The Primary School Achievement Certificate (PSAC) marks the end of primary schooling after six years of study, following which, students complete the lower secondary cycle after another three years of basic education.

Greater flexibility in the curriculum at lower secondary makes space for accommodating students of different abilities, aptitudes and with different learning paces. Students who did not meet the PSAC requirements, follow an extended four-year cycle and in smaller class sizes, thereby allowing them more time to develop the essential competencies of basic education.

At the end of Grade 9, students sit for the National Certificate of Education assessment, which certifies the level of attainment at the end of the basic education cycle. Students then progress to upper secondary or opt for vocational or technical education programmes.

Students completing the upper secondary cycle after Grade 13 sit either for the Higher School Certificate (HSC) or the General Certificate of Education (GCE-A level).

Upon successfully completing the HSC, students are eligible for studies offered by the polytechnics or higher education institutions.

The Higher Education sector comprises a wide range of tertiary educational institutions, amongst which ten are publicly funded with a further forty-two institutions being privately owned and administered.

This publication presents statistics on education in brief. More detailed statistics are available in the Digest of Education Statistics on Statistics Mauritius website at https://statsmauritius.govmu.org. It is to be noted that due to COVID-19 pandemic, there has been a change in school calendar and therefore the annual survey was conducted in October 2021 instead of March 2021.

The data refer to the Republic of Mauritius and cover pre-primary, primary, secondary, technical and vocational, education in specialized institutions as well as tertiary level education.












In October 2021, there were 789 schools providing pre-primary education, representing a decrease of 4.7% compared to March 2020. Of these schools, 192 were run by the state (i.e Early Childhood Care and Education Authority) and the remaining 597 were privately run. In October 2021, total enrolment in pre-primary schools numbered 23,603 of whom 11,514 were girls. Enrolment in pre-primary schools decreased by 2,559 (1,544 boys and 1,015 girls)from March 2020 to October 2021. In October 2021, the pre-primary teaching staff was 1,831 representing a decrease of around 12.9% compared to March 2020.




Primary enrolment and number of schools, 2017 - 2021

Percentage of primary enrolment by type of administration, 2021




In October 2021, there were 319 schools providing primary education, representing an increase of 0.3% compared to March 2020. The majority (221) of the schools was run by government, 53 were private-aided and 45 were private unaided schools. The primary school population in the Republic of Mauritius stood at 84,129 in October 2021, repesenting an increase of 2.0% compared to March 2020. Girls represented 49.7% of the 2021 primary school population. The primary education teaching staff was 5,936 in October 2021, represening an increase of 0.6% compared to March 2020.





Secondary enrolment by type of administration, 2017 - 2021




In October 2021, there were 178 schools dispensing secondary education. State-administered schools numbered 69, while the remaining 109 were private schools. A slight decrease in the number of Private Aided schools was noted from March 2020 to October 2021. Secondary education enrolment decreased by 2.7%, from 105,606 in March 2020 to 102,722 in October 2021. In October 2021, the number of teachers working in secondary schools was 9,379 representing a decrease of 1.7% over the 2020 figure.







The majority of tertiary students (86%) were enrolled locally in both public funded institutions (57.1%) and private institutions (29%). The remaining 14% of students were enrolled overseas. Social Science, Business and Law is the most popular discipline (57.2%), followed by Science (12.9%), Engineering, Manufacturing & Construction (6.9%), Health and Welfare (6.5%), Education (6.3%), Humanities and Art (5.6%), Services, Other field of study & Agriculture (4.6%).



In 2020/2021, the number of school candidates who took part in PSAC Assessment in the Republic of Mauritius was 14,116. Excluding re-assessment, the overall percentage meeting PSAC requirement works out to 73.9 It is to be noted that the percentage meeting PSAC requirement, including re-assessed school candidates, works out to 78. The performance of girls, including re-assessment exceeded that of boys with respective pass rates of 83.4% and 72.8%.





GLOSSARY

1 Adult Literacy Rate

Percentage of persons aged 15 years and above who can, with understanding, both read and write a simple statement.

2 Apparent Intake Rate

Number of new entrants in Grade 1 in primary schools as a percentage of the population aged 5 years.

3 Gross Domestic Product (GDP) at Market Price

The aggregate money value of all goods and services produced within the country out of the economic activity during a specified period of time usually a year (before provision for the consumption of fixed capital) at basic prices plus taxes on products.

4 Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER)

Number of pupils enrolled in a given level of education, regardless of age, expressed as a percentage of the population in the relevant age-group:

- → 4-5 years for pre-primary level
- \rightarrow 6-11 years for primary level
- →12-19 years for secondary level
- → 20-24 years for tertiary level

5 Gender Parity Index (GPI)

Ratio of the GER for female to the GER for male. It measures the relative education participation of boys and girls. A GPI of 1 reflects equal enrolment rate for boys and girls, whereas a GPI greater than 1 shows disparity in favour of girls.

6 Literacy Gender Parity Index

The ratio of adult female literacy rate to adult male literacy rate. A perfect Gender Parity Index would imply that the index is equal to 1

7 Literacy Rate

Percentage of persons aged 12 years and above who can, with understanding, both read and write a simple statement.

8 Population Growth Rate (PGR)

It is the rate at which the number of individuals in a population increases in a given time period as a fraction of the initial population. Specifically, PGR ordinarily refers to the change in population over a unit time period, often expressed as a percentage of the number of individuals in the population at the beginning of that period.

9 Primary Completion Rate

The ratio of the number of pupils successfully completing the last year of primary school (Grade 6) in a given year to the total number of children aged 10 years in the population.

10 Pupil/Teacher Ratio

The average number of pupils per teacher at a given level of education in a given year.

11 Unemployment Rate

Unemployment rate is the ratio (%) of unemployment to labour force.
