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Glossary

INTRODUCTION

Education in Mauritius is compulsory from age five up to the age of sixteen. The present education system allows a pupil to study for a period of two years at pre-primary level. At the end of the primary cycle, of six years duration, Standard VI pupils sit for the Certificate of Primary Education (CPE) examinations. After three years of secondary schooling, students are required to sit for the National Form III Assessment, which aims at providing a "checkpoint" between the CPE examinations and the School Certificate (SC) examinations. The CPE examinations qualify pupils for a five-year secondary education leading to the Cambridge School Certificate or the General Certificate of Education (GCE-O Level). An additional two years of schooling prepares students for Higher School Certificate (HSC) or General Certificate of Education (GCE-A Level).

Pre-Vocational Education (PVE) is provided in secondary schools for those who have failed the CPE examinations. It provides them with a second chance through a four-year programme that aims at bridging their learning gaps and preparing them for further vocational training. The PVE programme is conducted in the secondary schools for the first three years and in Mauritius Institute of Training and Development (MITD) centres for the fourth year. Successful completion leads to the award of a National Qualifications Framework (NQF) level 2 certificate that allows the student to either join the world of work or continue with further vocational training at National Certificate Level 3 (NC3).

On passing HSC, students are eligible for post secondary and university studies offered by polytechnics and a number of tertiary education institutions, including the University of Mauritius and the University of Technology.

The Tertiary Education sector currently boasts a wide range of educational institutions, amongst which nine are publicly funded tertiary education institutions whereas a further fifty-five institutions are privately owned and administered.









In March 2015, there were 939 schools providing pre-primary education representing a decrease of 1.9% compared to 2014. Of these schools, 188 were run by the Early Childhood Care and Education Authority (ECCEA) and the remaining 751 were privately run.

In 2015, total enrolment in pre-primary schools numbered 29,832, of whom 14,819 were girls. Enrolment in pre-primary schools decreased by 310 (142 boys and 168 girls) from 2014 to 2015. In 2015, the pre-primary teaching staff was 2,284, representing a decrease of around 5.0% compared to 2014.











Primary enrolment and number of schools, 2011 - 2015

In March 2015, there were 320 schools providing primary education, same as in 2014. The majority (223) of the schools was run by government, 53 were private-aided and 44 were private unaided schools. The primary school population in the Republic of Mauritius stood at 101,422 in 2015, representing a decrease of 3.7% compared to 2014. Boys represented 50.6% of the 2015 primary school population. The primary education teaching staff was 5,400 in 2015, down by around 4% compared to 2014.



In 2015, there were 177 schools dispensing secondary general education. State-administered schools numbered 68, while the remaining 109 were private schools. A slight decrease in the number of Private Aided schools and an increase in Private Unaided schools were noted from 2014 to 2015. Secondary education enrolment increased from 114,239 in 2014 to reach 114,311 in 2015. In 2015, the number of teachers working in secondary schools was 7,531, representing a increase of 1.4% over the 2014 figure.



The National Form III Assessment aims at providing a 'checkpoint' between the CPE examinations and the School Certificate examinations. It allows schools, students and other stakeholders to take stock of the progress in learning which has taken place in the lower secondary. Schools can therefore evaluate students' performance and hence, make the necessary adjustments in pedagogy.


The highest pass rate (73.4%) was observed in Computer Studies and the lowest pass rate (32.6%) was observed in Physics.


At March 2015, 119 schools (of which 118 offered secondary general as well) were offering pre-vocational education. Some 44 of these schools were state-owned while the remaining 75 were private schools. At March 2015, enrolment in the schools offering pre-vocational education was 10,660, of which 65% were boys. The pre-vocational teaching staff stood at 906 in 2015, representing a decrease of around 7.6% compared to 2014.






Enrolment in Specialised Education Needs schools by type of impairment and sex, 2015



As at March 2015, the number of students enrolled in Special Education Needs schools stood at 2,301 (of whom 64% were boys). 

The majority of tertiary students (77%) were enrolled locally in both public funded institutions (44%) and private institutions (33%). The remaining 23% of students were enrolled overseas. Social Science, Business and Law is the most popular discipline (52%), followed by Science (12%), Engineering, Manufacturing & Construction (9%), Health and Welfare (9%), Education, Humanities and Art, Services, Agriculture & Other field of study.



In 2015, the number of school candidates who took part in CPE examinations in the Republic of Mauritius was 20,434. Excluding re-sit, the pass rate for first sitting works out to 77.7%. With the inclusion of re-sit examinations, the pass rate for first sitting among school candidates works out to 81.2% in 2015.





ICT¹ in Pre-primary, Primary and Secondary schools - 2015

In March 2015, out of the 939 pre-primary schools in the Republic of Mauritius, 439 (47%) had computers. All primary and secondary schools (general & pre-vocational) were equipped with computers. Schools having internet access for students stood at 10% in pre-primary, 41% in primary and 99% in secondary.

Glossary

1 Adult Literacy Rate

Percentage of persons aged 15^+ years who can, with understanding, both read and write a simple statement.

2 Apparent Intake Rate

Number of new entrants in Standard I in primary schools as a percentage of the population aged 5 years.

3 Gender Parity Index (GPI)

Ratio of the GER for female to the GER for male. It measures the relative education participation of boys and girls. A GPI of 1.0 reflects equal enrolment rate for boys and girls, whereas a GPI greater than 1.0 shows disparity in favour of girls.

4 Gross Domestic Product (GDP) at Market Price

The aggregate money value of all goods and services produced within the country out of the economic activity during a specified period of time usually a year (before provision for the consumption of fixed capital) at basic prices plus taxes on products.

5 Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER)

Number of pupils enrolled in a given level of education, regardless of age, expressed as a percentage of the population in the relevant age-group:

- 4-5 years for pre-primary level

- 6-11 years for primary level
- 12-19 years for secondary level
- 20-24 years for tertiary level

6 Literacy Gender Parity Index

The ratio of adult female literacy rate to adult male literacy rate. A perfect Gender Parity Index would imply that the index is equal to 1.0

7 Literacy Rate

Percentage of persons aged 12^+ years who can, with understanding, both read and write a simple statement.

8 Population Growth Rate

It is the rate at which the number of individuals in a population increases in a given time period as a fraction of the initial population. Specifically, PGR ordinarily refers to the change in population over a unit time period, often expressed as a percentage of the number of individuals in the population at the beginning of that period.

9 Primary Completion Rate

The ratio of the number of pupils successfully completing the last year of primary school (Standard VI) in a given year to the total number of children aged 10 years in the population.

10 Pupil/Teacher Ratio

The average number of pupils per teacher at a given level of education in a given year.

11 Transition Rate

The proportion of pupils progressing from the primary cycle (i.e Std VI) to the Secondary cycle (Form I and Year I Prevoc), expressed as a percentage of the number of pupils enrolled at STD VI in primary school in the previous year.

12 Unemployment Rate

Unemployment rate is the ratio (%) of unemployment to labour force.
